

## RFK- Family Reunification

### Family members who can obtain a family reunification visa

- The spouse, not separated in fact or in law, or the person who maintains a partnership with the applicant that is analogous to a marital relationship (partner entered on a public register, provided that the registration has not been cancelled, or unregistered partner provided that proof can be provided of the continuity of a cohabitation relationship established before the applicant settled in Spain). Reunification cannot be offered to more than one spouse or partner.
- The children of the applicant, the children of the spouse or partner—including adopted children (provided that the adoption is valid in Spain)—and those represented legally by the applicant, provided that they are under the age of 18 or that they have disabilities and are not objectively capable of providing for their own needs due to their health status.
- The applicant's parents (mother or father) and those of their spouse or partner, provided that they are in the care of the applicant, they are older than 65 and there are reasons substantiating the need to authorize their residence in Spain. On an exceptional basis, and for humanitarian reasons, the reunification of parents under the age of 65 may be permitted.

		* <b>National visa application form:</b> Each applicant must complete and sign a visa application, filling in each of its sections. If the applicant is a minor, both of their parents or a duly accredited representative must sign the application.
		* <b>Valid, unexpired passport.</b> Original and a photocopy of the page or pages of the passport that contain biometric data. The passport must have a minimum validity period of 4 months and contain two blank pages. Passports issued more than 10 years ago will not be accepted.
		* <b>Previous Passports.</b>
		* <b>Legalized and translated Shenanameh:</b> (Spanish translation for the last 6 month). For all the family members. If anyone has been born in Spain, he/she should provide it.
		* <b>Photograph:</b> A recent, 3.5*4.5,(for the last 3 month) color photograph,, taken against a light background, facing forward, without dark or reflective glasses, or any garments concealing the oval of the face.
		* <b>Medical certificate:</b> (for the last 3 month) Applicants requiring a visa for a stay of more than 180 days must submit the original and a copy of a medical certificate accrediting that they do not suffer from any disease that could cause serious repercussions for public health pursuant to the 2005 International Health Regulations. Foreign documents must be legalized or apostilled and, where applicable, must be submitted together with an official translation into Spanish.

		* From Spain: copy of “ <b>Autorización de Residencia Temporal por Reagrupación Familiar</b> ” issued by “Delegación o Subdelegación del Gobierno”.
		* <b>Criminal record check certificate. (for the last 3 month)</b> : Applicants of legal age who apply for a visa for a stay of more than 180 days must submit the original and a copy of the criminal record check certificate(s) issued by their country or countries of residence for the past 5 years. Foreign documents must be legalized or apostilled and, where applicable, must be submitted together with an official translation into Spanish.
		* <b>Documents proving family relationship with the applicant.</b> a) Marriage certificate for the spouse. In the event of second or successive marriage, proof of divorce from the previous spouse. b) Birth certificates for children.
		* <b>Copy of the valid residence card of the family member residing in Spain</b>
